Our 17 Boys & Girls Clubs in Fresno County do provide many sports and recreation programs, but much more than that. Kids

who participate in our Clubs are provided educational experience in nutrition, technology, arts and crafts and most importantly experienced staff and volunteers who genuinely care about them. Today I learned of Joey, a 13 year old who has been attending one of our Clubs for almost a year. Joey has severe emotional difficulties. He was withdrawn and exhibited some very anti-social behavior. In the last few months Joey's behavior has remarkably changed. He is now outgoing and wanting to be involved in everything at the Club. He is a different person.

At a time that is so difficult for all of us financially, we recognize the need for stronger organizational leadership than ever. This month Diane Carbray our Assistant Executive Director for the past 3 years was appointed Executive Director of our organization. Before Diane came to us she and her husband John Carbray brought the Grizzlies Triple A baseball team to Fresno and built a home for the Grizzlies now known as Chukchansi Park. Our organization is blessed to have a person with Diane's organization and management capabilities and experience heading up the operations of Boys & Girls Clubs of Fresno County.

Youth of the Year Eric Sanchez

Eric Sanchez, 17, has been a member of the Orange Cove Boys & Girls Club for seven years. When Eric was eight, his father left and has not returned. Eric's mother has worked as a farm laborer to care for Eric and his two younger sisters. When work was scarce, income was too, and the family often traveled to Washington to work in the apple harvest.

Once a close family relative told Eric's mother never to get an education for her son, because he would only be a farm laborer all his life. But his mother insisted that he work hard in school. Today, we see the result.

While his mother worked, Eric took responsibility for the family, doing household duties and other chores. He got a part time job as a Youth Mentor so he could help his mom by purchasing clothing and school supplies for his sisters and himself.

At age ten, Eric joined the Boys & Girls Club, participating in many club activities. He helps out wherever needed, tutoring, setting up, cleaning up, playing games and helping with computers.

As he graduates from high school this year, Eric's college application has been accepted. His goal is a career in civil engineering.

When asked about the Club, Eric replies, "The Boys & Girls Club means so much to me. The Club is a place where I can laugh and be cheerful. It is a place where I can be myself. This place has become my second home and I know I can always come here if I want to feel safe."

Out of a group of seven excellent young people, Eric was chosen by a panel of judges to become this year's Youth of the Year for the Boys & Girls Clubs of Fresno County. We are very proud of Eric and congratulate him and his family on this achievement.

Maria's home is not located in the best area; she lives in a very low income part of town plagued by constant violence and gang activity. Her neighborhood is home to frequent shootings and crime. Maria has not been unaffected by all the negative influences surrounding her. In fact, she came to the East Fresno Boys & Girls Club to perform community service hours mandated by the court for being with a friend who was stealing. She made a bad choice and gave in to peer pressure.

Maria and her parents feel strongly that the Club has made a difference in her life and has helped her to be more independent which has led to a greater amount of trust between her parents and herself. After her arrest, Maria felt at first that she had disappointed her family and that they would never forgive her mistake or trust her again.

That all changed when she came to the club and her parents realized that she was capable of being responsible for her own actions. Maria and her parents are now communicating positively and she is more willing to seek advice and counsel from them.

Maria is actively involved in Keystone, a leadership group within the club, and through the program has learned to become a strong role model. The programs have helped her to become more focused, responsible and independent.

"The club is home," Maria says. "It is hope. It is what I look forward to every day and where I can just be a kid. The club has transformed me into a person that I would never have thought I would be. The club has taught me to be more and has taught me that mistakes are not the end of the world. Instead, they are lessons that teach me to change my ways."

Maria's story could be repeated over and over again. Through your investment in the work of the Clubs, you are changing her life, and the lives of more than 12,000 other young people every year. These are your dollars at work.
